

Bringing the Faith-Science Dialogue in Concert with Sunday Morning

Studies show that: 1) many young Christians have come to the conclusion that faith and science are incompatible; 2) one of the top reasons young people are leaving the church today is the perception that the church is anti-science; and 3) young people in schools worldwide have the perception of conflict between science and religious faith by the age of 11. But, what appears to be an obstacle or challenge for the local church today--interfacing with a culture increasingly shaped by science--can be an opportunity for new expressions of discipleship, worship, and evangelistic outreach. Christ Crossman UMC (located in Falls Church, Virginia, just outside of Washington, D.C.) has seen the fruits of intentionally facilitating the faith-science dialogue for every age in the congregation. Specifically, it has incorporated hands-on science in its children's lessons; explored science-and-religion issues in its confirmation classes; and hosted the faith-science dialogue in its worship services. The positive impacts have been seen in feedback from parents and congregants and in increased attendance. This case study suggests that bringing the topics of science into Sunday morning church programming not only makes for more robust discipleship for all ages but also can be an innovative means for witness, evangelism, and community outreach.
